Coastal Cleanup: Thea Chandross reported that five members (Donna Gray, Connie Ryan, Ann McKinney, Thea and Maggie Baker) who participated on the September 22th. Our area was South from McCabe's parking lot from York down to Sunset beach then crossing to the other side and going North. We covered about 2 miles and collected 35# of litter. OVHS: Maureen Eisenhart reported that we are in negotiations with Ocean View Historical Society to see what gardening ideas they have for their new "store". Martha Gallagher, Alva

Hutchison and Maureen will meet with an OVHS Board member on 10/22. The earliest this project will happen will be Spring, 2021.

Habitat for Humanity: Eileen Quigley has selected October 21, 2020 at 4pm to present a planter with fall flowers to a new homeowner dedication in Ellendale.

Flower Show: The schedule will need to be updated and sent to Dottie Howett by Jan.1, 2021. Ellen will get updates to Lisa. We still need a publicity person. The Garden and Art Tour chairs and the Ways and Means chairs have been working on publication options for the tour and ideas for fundraising. To date there are 5 gardens, Ocean View Historical Society Village, 3 Art Galleries and Plein Air Artists for a couple of gardens complementary of Gallery One.

Membership: Karen Plis stated we have 41 members with 4 more after this meeting. Karen has been in touch with several others that have shown an interest. We are going to be welcoming more members in the future, hopefully reaching our maximum of 55. Currently we have a lot of seasoned, knowledgeable members who would have a lot to offer new ones- sharing knowledge of GBTS, and learning the individuals interests and talents, and how best to incorporate those in our club. If you would agree to be a mentor, you would be part of the membership committee only in the capacity of mentoring. The procedure for mentoring is self- explanatory. And we would periodically have discussions as to how things progress with our mentees. Alva has agreed to be a mentor. Horticulture Moment: Pat Drizd Glorious Gourds Design Challenge

Gourds are grown on a vine and prefer full sun and regular water. They can grow up to 15' and can be ornamental with various shapes, sizes and colors. Some are pumpkins, squash, melons and those of various shapes.

The challenge to the members is to make a floral design with a gourd. The gourd can be the vessel in which the design is placed or can be part of an overall design. Place your design next to you at our next meeting (Zoom or in person) so we can view everyone's creativity.
